- Overnight field trips for LHS, MHS and American Indian program
- The Board also ratified the contracts for Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent Business Services and Education Services, extending it to 2025-26 school year. The Board had approved this last May but we had failed to bring it in for approval earlier this year.
- We are applying for a tax rebate for energy efficiency. The fees to start this work
 with the State of California will be paid from the tax rebate and is not a cost to the
 district.

We had a robust discussion on the Health curriculum offered in grades 7 and 9. It is really important for parents to know that you can waive your student's participation from a section that you don't feel is appropriate for your student. We also heard from a parent who pointed out that schools had students walking or playing around with tails and animal masks. Today we saw that a few FB posts have also been made. Unfortunately this was never brought to our attention prior to the Board meeting. Now that we know, we are working with our sites to address this concern.
